SUMMIT INTRODUCTION

In response to a call that he first felt while serving in Vietnam, he left a budding business career to work with delinguent urban youth. Dr. Lupton and his family sold their suburban home and moved into the innercity where they have lived and served as neighbors among those in need. His life's work has been the rebuilding of urban neighborhoods where families flourish and children grow into healthy adults.



Dr. Lupton is a community developer and an entrepreneur who brings together communities of resource with communities of need. Through Focused Community Strategies, he has:

- developed three mixed-income subdivisions,
- · organized two multi-racial congregations,
- started a number of businesses,
- created housing for hundreds of families, and
- initiated a wide range of human services in his community.

He is the author of six books including the best-selling Toxic Charity.

Dr. Lupton has a PhD. in psychology from the University of Georgia. He serves as a speaker, strategist and inspirer with those who seek God's Shalom in the city.


